In 1947, shortly after the end of World War II, Cardinal Cushing saw the need to develop a new Catholic High School. He founded Matignon High School as the first co-educational, Central Catholic Archdiocesan High School designed to educate students to meet the needs of a changing world. Over fifty years later, Matignon High School has adapted to that changing world and continues to provide a new environment to educate students to meet the changing world of today . . . and to change the world of tomorrow.

Matignon High School is a co-educational, independent Catholic high school committed to teaching and promoting Catholic morals and principles, academic excellence and respect for oneself and others. Matignon High School is dedicated to motivating life-long learners to meet today's challenges and to positively contribute to the future of the global community.

Matignon High School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. THE STUDENTS

Matignon High School admits students of any race, national and ethnic background to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities available at the school. Current enrollment is three hundred (300) young men and women. This year's senior class numbers sixty-one (61) students.

THE CURRICULUM

Matignon High School's academic year consists of two semesters with two quarters in each semester. Matignon High School students are urged to follow as rigorous and challenging a program as possible to develop their God-given talents to the fullest, increase their chances for admission to the college of their choice, and expand and enhance their options and potential for success in college and in life.

Matignon High School students are taught to become critical thinkers and are encouraged to cultivate habits of sound decision-making and of social responses based on Christian values. Matignon High School encourages students to develop the skills to be active, life-long learners.

Courses at Matignon High School are offered on four levels: Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (H), College Preparatory One (L1) and College Preparatory Two (L2). These designations do not describe students or their abilities, but rather the relative degree of difficulty of each course. The following Advanced Placement courses are offered at Matignon High School: AP Biology, AP Calculus, AP English, AP Latin, AP French, AP Spanish and AP United States History.
